## Masses:

Every Sunday 4pm,

confessions 3.15-3.45pm on the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the month; no confessions before Mass on 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the month. Confessions **after** each Sunday Mass for as long as necessary, no limit. (Missa Cantata every 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday; Low Mass every other Sunday).

Weekday Masses: Wednesday and Friday 7pm; confessions 6.15-6.45pm.

**Receiving Holy Communion**: [This] Pontifical Commission would like to point out that the celebration of Holy Mass in the Extraordinary Form envisages the reception of Holy Communion while kneeling, as the Sacred Host is laid directly on the tongue of the communicant. There is no provision for the distribution of Holy Communion on the hand in this Form of the Holy Mass. [From the Secretariat of the Pontifical Commission "Ecclesia Dei". Vatican 21/6/2010].

<u>First Confessions:</u> Before the Second Sunday of Lent there will be first confessions at 3.15pm. I encourage all children who have already made their first confession, but not yet been confirmed, to also come and attend the 3.15-3.45pm time slot. Children will have preference over adults in the confession queue. Any parent who has a child yet to make their first confession but would like to be prepared by proper catechesis, please contact Father Doohan and another opportunity during Lent will be made either before or after Masses.

<u>First Holy Communion:</u> any child who has reached the age of discernment (this can vary but can be as early as six or seven years old) and who would like to make their first Holy Communion this May, please contact Father Doohan as we plan to arrange for catechism classes beginning in Lent. This will involve parents, teachers and Priest in various forms of tuition. Preparation for first confession can also be made during this time.

<u>Confession Times:</u> have now been extended to be available **AFTER** every Sunday Mass (as well as the normal half an hour beforehand), which gives everyone the chance to make regular confession more easily. No time limit. Please queue outside on the benches, there shouldn't be long gaps in between each penitent leaving.

<u>Second Sunday of Lent:</u> 17<sup>th</sup> of March is normally St Patrick's Day, so after Holy Mass there will be the blessing of babies and children with a first class relic of St Patrick. Veneration of the relic afterwards for everyone else will also be possible.

**<u>Bishop Robson's 40<sup>th</sup> Jubilee:</u>** Thank-you for the £110 raised from the second collection last week.

<u>Dundee 40 Days for Life:</u> 3 time slots of 12noon-2pm and 6-7pm (Mon -Thurs). Casual visitors are most welcome to come and pray for an hour.
