confessions 3.15-3.45pm on the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 5th Sunday of the month;
 no confessions before Mass on 4th Sunday of the month.

Confessions **after** each Sunday Mass for as long as necessary, no limit.
 (Missa Cantata every 2nd and 4th Sunday; Low Mass every other Sunday).

Weekday Masses: Wednesday and Friday 7pm; confessions 6.15-6.45pm.

Receiving Holy Communion: [This] Pontifical Commission would like to point out that the celebration of Holy Mass in the Extraordinary Form envisages the reception of Holy Communion while kneeling, as the Sacred Host is laid directly

on the tongue of the communicant. There is no provision for the distribution of Holy Communion on the hand in this Form of the Holy Mass. [From the Secretariat of the Pontifical Commission "Ecclesia Dei". Vatican 21/6/2010].

N.B. At the Latin Mass no blessings are conferred on the faithful at the altar rail, in place of receiving Holy Communion.

Those unable to receive at this time, for whatever reason, are invited to make a spiritual Holy Communion kneeling in their pew.

October is Rosary and Mission Month: before each Sunday Mass at 3.40pm the Holy Rosary will be prayed in common to prepare for Holy Mass. Confessions must end at 3.40pm sharp for Father to lead these devotions.

OCTOBER PRAYER TO ST JOSEPH

Prescribed by Pope Leo XIII to be said at the conclusion of the Holy Rosary and Litany of Loreto

To thee, O blessed Joseph, we fly in our tribulation and, after imploring the help of thy holy Spouse, with confidence we ask also for thy intercession. From thy place in heaven be thou mercifully with us, most powerful protector, in this warfare with the powers of darkness; and, as thou didst once rescue the Child Jesus from imminent danger of death, so now defend the holy Church of God from the snares of the enemy and from all adversity. Guard each of us by thy constant patronage, so that, sustained by thy example and help, we may live a holy life, die a holy death, and obtain the everlasting happiness of heaven. Amen.


